7. We opened our Family Workshop to the general public where families can engage in a challenging science project twice a week.

5. SEE hosted our 5th annual Camp Summer Science for students entering Grades 3 through 6.
4. Awards! For the 5th year in a row SEE was voted by the readers of the HippoPress as the Overall Winner of the Best Places to Take Your Kids category. And we were awarded the Favorite Family Outing Award from Parenting New Hampshire Magazine's Reader's Poll.
3. SEE added science, math and physics themed LEGO workshops and mini-courses to our list of public programs, thanks to our new partner, Brickapalooza.
2. The SEE Science Center turned 25 this year! (We opened our doors in 1986)
